Day by Day Itinerary

Sun., November 6 – OMAHA / EN ROUTE

We depart Omaha's Eppley Airfield today for the overnight transatlantic flight on scheduled service of Delta and KLM Royal Dutch Airlines, traveling via Atlanta and Amsterdam, en route to Prague, Czech Republic.

Mon., November 7 – PRAGUE / CARLSBAD (I,D)

As the sun begins to rise on the coast of Europe, we arrive and change planes for the connecting flight to Prague, Czech Republic, where we'll meet our Tour Escort who will accompany us on vacation. Leaving Prague we'll travel to the westernmost part of the historical region of Bohemia to arrive in Carlsbad, the largest of the spa towns, beautifully situated in a deep wooded valley of the Tepla River.

Tue., November 8 – CARLSBAD (B.D)

Carlsbad, also known as Karlovy Vary, was founded in 1358 by the Emperor Charles IV after he stumbled across a hot spring during a hunting expedition. To this day, the town continues to owe its international fame to its mineral springs, the most famous of which is the Vridlo, with a geyser of water reaching to a height of 10 to 15 meters. A tour of Carlsbad will introduce us to the Market and Castle Colonnades along with their famed mineral springs. We'll also see the town's remarkable monuments, and escape to its green parks before enjoying a funicular ride to the Diana Observation Tower lookout for a beautiful view of the surrounding countryside. Afterward, we'll visit the Moser Glass Factory, established by engraver Ludwig Moser in 1857, where we'll receive a true insight into this time honored Bohemian tradition. A guided tour will take us through the workshops and show us the various stages of the glassmaking process, while observing the craftsmanship of the glasscutters and glassblowers as they go about their work. On our return to Karlovy Vary the afternoon is at leisure to stroll through the picturesque boulevards lined with colonnades, and to visit the charming shops and elegant cafés.

Wed., November 9 – CARLSBAD / CESKE BUDEJOVICE (Pilsen) (B,D)

This morning we depart Carlsbad and travel across the Bohemian countryside to Pilsen. Founded by King Wenceslas II in 1295, Pilsen is home to some of the world's best-known breweries and we'll stop to visit Plzensky Prazdroj for a tour of the brewery. Afterward, we'll continue our journey through the beautiful south Bohemian countryside, interwoven with little villages and enchanting rivers, as we make our way to Ceske Budejovice. Founded in the mid-13th century as a royal city, the capital of Southern Bohemia has managed to preserve its historical character over the centuries. We'll begin our tour of Ceske Budejovice at the square piazza named after King Premysl Otakar II, one of the largest squares in Europe, whose arcades and range of Gothic. Renaissance and Baroque burgher's houses make it one of the most attractive in the Czech Republic. We'll see the symbol of Ceske Budejovice, Samson's Fountain, a magnificent Baroque work incorporating a sculpture of Samson fighting a lion, the Town Hall with its monumental façade enhanced by three towers, and the Cathedral of St. Nicholas, where you'll have an opportunity to climb to the gallery at the top of the Black Tower for a unique panoramic view of the city.

Thu., November 10 – CESKE BUDEJOVICE (Cesky Krumlov)

Today we travel to the medieval town of Cesky Krumlov. This picturesque town is found in a deep meandering valley along the upper Vltava River, and its architecture has been preserved through the ages thanks to the area's peaceful history. Our tour will include a visit to the Castle and Chateau of Cesky Krumlov founded by the Vitkovec family in the first half of the 13th century. Unusually large for a town of Krumlov's size, the castle complex consists of 40 buildings and palaces, as well as gardens, courtyards, and a moat with resident bears. One of the highlights is the well-preserved Baroque Theater, which dates back to the 1400's, not to mention the view of the Old Town below. Following our tour of the castle, we'll have an opportunity to stroll through the narrow cobblestone streets of the Old Town where we'll find an enchanted atmosphere, surrounded by more than 300 well-preserved historical buildings, centuries old townhomes, inns, shops, and cafes.

Fri., November 11 – CESKE BUDEJOVICE / PRAGUE (Kutna Hora) (B,D)

This morning we depart Ceske Budejovice and travel to the ancient silver mining town of Kutna Hora. The town originated as a small mining community in the second half of the 13th century when rich deposits of silver were found. Upon discovery, the king took over the licensing of the mines and Kutna Hora later became the second most important town in Bohemia. Our visit will include a walking tour of the medieval town and a visit to the Italian Court, Kutna Hora's former Royal Mint that once produced the Prague groschen. We'll also see a wonderful example of Bohemian Gothic when we visit the Church of St. Barbara with its three massive and tent-shaped spires rising above a forest of flying buttresses. Afterward we'll visit the ghoulish, but fascinating, 12th century Gothic Ossuary Chapel at Sedlec. The site holds 40,000 sets of bones arranged in the shape of gigantic bells and cherubs. However, the main draw is a chandelier made out of all the bones of the human body. Then we're headed to the Czech Republic's "Golden City of the Hundred Spires." One of the world's most impressive capital cities, we'll soon find out that Prague is full of thrilling history and glorious architecture.

Sat. November 12 – PRAGUE (B)

Our introduction to Prague begins high above the Vltava River with a visit to Prague Castle. Despite periodic fires and invasions, Prague Castle has retained historic buildings and towers from every period of its long history. Located inside the castle walls we'll visit the city's most distinctive landmark, St. Vitus's Cathedral, where a guided tour will take us back through a thousand years of history. Afterward, we'll take in the charming artisan cottages along the Golden Lane. Named after the goldsmiths who lived here in the 17th century, and once home to well-known writers including Franz Kafka, the Golden Lane is one of the most picturesque streets in all of Prague.

Sun., November 13 – PRAGUE (B)

This morning an *optional* tour will be offered to Karlstejn Castle, one of the most impressive High Gothic castles in the

Czech Republic. The castle was built by Czech King and Roman Emperor Charles IV as a royal treasury; however both the King and his son Wenceslas frequently used the castle as a country home. Situated on a rocky outcrop surrounded by five low hills, a horse-drawn carriage ride will take us up to the easily defensible location, which combined with its architecture, created a formidable stronghold.

This afternoon we'll walk the magnificent Charles Bridge and explore the Old Town Square. Until 1741, the Charles Bridge was the only crossing over the Vltava River. Today Prague's most familiar landmark is a pedestrian bridge offering locals and visitors alike a virtual outdoor museum of no less than 30 religious statues. In the Old Town Square we'll view the superbly preserved medieval astronomical clock with its moving figures of the apostles, as well as the magnificent houses that surround the square.

Mon., November 14 – PRAGUE / OMAHA (B,I)

Early this morning we travel to Prague's Ruzyne International Airport, where our tour escort will assist with check-in formalities, in preparation for our return journey home, once again traveling via Amsterdam and Atlanta. No better time to reflect on memories of our Czech Republic Heritage Vacation to last a lifetime and new friendships made along the way!

TOUR DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT: Payment is accepted by personal or bank checks. YOU WILL BE INVOICED FOR THE BALANCE OF PAYMENT DUE ON OR BEFORE FRIDAY, AUGUST 5, 2016.

ARRANGEMENTS: The tour price is based on a minimum participation of 30 persons and includes planning, handling and operational charges and is quoted on the current rate of exchange, tariff rates and airfares in effect as of January 1, 2016. In the event of a marked increase or decrease in foreign currency or in tariff rates, the cost is subject to revision.

TOUR PRICING: This is a package tour in which land tour costs and special group airfares have been combined in the most advantageous way. Should you wish to take the land tour only or deviate from the package tour by changing your departure and/or return dates of travel, this will eliminate the advantages of the package tour price and special group airfares.
